Academic Supports and Expectations for New Families

Overview

Welcome to Lincoln Prep! We are excited for your student to join us next Fall. Because of our rigorous curriculum, new students may be required to take courses through our Summer Academy to be prepared to succeed. Other optional courses may help younger students acclimate to the school.

Sixth Grade

Our curriculum begins in sixth grade, so there are no pre-requisite requirements. However, we offer two courses designed for new sixth-grade students: Prep Study Skills supports our expectations for study, participation, note-taking, etc.; Prep for Prep Math reviews all the math needed for Sixth-Grade Math.

-Recommended Courses: Prep Study Skills; Prep for Prep Math

Seventh Grade

Students joining in seventh grade are enrolled in Latin II, so new seventh-grade students must take Latin over the summer. We also recommend Math Fundamentals (a review of our sixth-grade curriculum) because new seventh-grade students are enrolled in Pre-Algebra. Finally, learning some foundational Study Skills in study, participation, and note taking can benefit many new seventh-grade students.

-Required Courses: Latin

-Recommended Courses: Math Fundamentals; Prep Study Skills

Eighth Grade

Students entering in eighth grade will be placed in Latin III as a pass/fail course; taking Latin over the summer is recommended to be able to thrive in this course. New eighth-grade students will also be placed in Algebra I; Math Fundamentals is recommended for those who have not taken Pre-Algebra.

-Required Courses: Math Fundamentals (if have not taken Pre-Algebra)
-Recommended Courses: Latin

Ninth Grade

Our curriculum is designed so that new ninth-grade students do not have any required prerequisites (e.g. options for a first year of foreign language, Geometry for math—requiring little Algebra background). Students entering as freshmen are likely to benefit from Summer Academy between 9th and 10th Grade.

Tenth-Twelfth Grade

Lincoln Prep has extensive and specific credit requirements, so all students entering part-way through high school are required to meet with the college counselor to discuss graduation requirements and create a plan to complete any needed credits, generally through BYU Online. A refresher in Algebra helps many students entering 10th-grade Algebra II.

-Required Courses: BYU HS Credit Recovery as communicated by college counselor -Recommended Courses: Algebra for High-School

Uniform Information

At Great Hearts schools, the student uniform is an essential part of who we are and what we do. The uniform serves to unify our students as one community of learners, irrespective of our diverse backgrounds. The uniform also signifies to the larger community our common purpose and identity as schools in pursuit of the true, the good, and the beautiful. Finally, the uniform frees our students to pursue their intellectual and moral development as individuals, without the distractions of fad and fashion. True individuality is formed in the heart and mind, not in appearances.

Our uniform vendor is Dennis Uniforms. We encourage you to visit Dennis <u>online</u> or their store front. Here, you will find all available uniform items for your students.

Lincoln Prep Uniform and Dress Code

All shirts, skirts, sweaters, and jackets must be purchased through Dennis Uniform and carry the school crest as noted below. All items must follow these quidelines.

<u>High School</u> — Students have the option of wearing a short or long sleeve white or light blue oxford dress shirt with the school crest. The oxford dress shirt with school crest must be pressed and worn fully buttoned with only the uppermost button undone. Seniors have the option to wear the oxford shirt with the designated tie and blazer, the tie, or the blazer. The tie is optional for juniors, but the blazer is only part of the senior uniform. High School Athletes may wear an academy sports polo shirt on their game day. Student Mentors may wear their mentor polo shirt on Fridays as well as to school events where they will be acting in a leadership capacity such as all-school assemblies, academic field day, athletic field day, and student orientations.

<u>Middle School</u> – Students have the option of wearing a short or long sleeve white or light blue polo shirt with school crest. A long sleeve, white oxford dress shirt may be worn with tie by members of extracurricular clubs/sports as competition day uniform attire. Middle School Athletes may wear academy sports polo shirt on their game day. Students may only wear a solid white undershirt, and its sleeves must be shorter than the sleeves of the polo shirt.

Sweater: A navy blue sweater with school crest (vest or full sleeve pullover or full sleeve cardigan). The solid navy sweater may be worn in the classroom and must be purchased from one of the uniform vendors for the sake of consistency. Students may also wear the navy Sport-Tek jacket and the full zip with the school logo sold by uniform vendors. No other sweaters may be worn in classrooms.

Dress Pants: Dress pants must be khaki colored, with belt loops. Acceptable fabrics for the dress pants are cotton, polyester, or poly-blend. A solid dark colored dress belt must be worn with the dress pants. Dress belts with a simple clasp or open buckle designs are acceptable. Pants must reach to the shoe but may not drag on the ground. (No khaki jeans or dungarees. No utility loops or patch pockets, extra zippers, Velcro, or extra seams.) Neither oversized, baggy pants nor tight ("skinny") pants will be permitted. Pants should be worn at the waist (and no boxers or undergarments may be visible – including at sports practices and games).

Shorts: Khaki walking shorts are a uniform option from the beginning of the school year to Fall Break and from Spring Break through the end of school year. Acceptable fabrics for the shorts are cotton, polyester, or poly-blend. No utility loops or patch pockets, extra zippers, Velcro, or extra seams. Shorts must be worn with a solid dark colored dress belt. Dress belts with a simple clasp or open buckle designs are acceptable. Shorts should extend to just above the knee.

Footwear/Socks: Any solid black shoe (including athletic shoes) is acceptable. The shoes must not contain any logos/marks/etc. that are any other color than black (i.e., no white, red, etc.). Laces on the shoe must also be black in color. Shoes cannot sit above the ankle bone. No high tops (i.e., Converse), boots, slippers, or sandals are permitted. Socks must extend above the ankle and be solid in color, free of logos, patterns, or decorations. White socks may only be worn with shorts. Students with medical foot problems requiring special footwear may wear shoes to fit their medical needs, however shoes must still be all black.

Hair: Hair should be neatly combed or styled. Hair must be above the top of the shirt collar. Hair should be styled so that it does not fall below the eyebrows or past the midpoint of the ear. Hair must be natural looking and conservative in its color and cut (no unnatural streaking/highlighting, no artificial jet-black coloring, and no unnatural colors). Hair may not change color during the school year. Accommodations for religious reasons are permitted.

Jewelry: All jewelry must be tasteful and worn in a non-distracting manner. Students are permitted to wear one watch, one finger ring and one necklace. Only simple, fine-gauged, 16 to 20-inch, silver or gold chain necklaces are permitted. Necklaces must be worn inside the shirt. One charity/motivational bracelet may be worn to support an appropriate cause provided it does not make inappropriate allusions.

Headwear: Hats, bandanas, and sunglasses will not be permitted indoors and must be stored in student lockers during the school day. Accommodations for religious reasons are permitted.


Letter Jacket: Letter-earning participants in extracurricular activities are eligible to purchase a letter jacket. Letter jackets may be worn in class. Students may only wear their own letter jackets.

Outerwear: All jackets, sweatshirts, and other outerwear should be free of distracting or inappropriate images and messages. Outerwear must be stored in student lockers during the school day. Except for the school letter jacket, outerwear may not be worn in classrooms.

Additional Guidelines: If an item of dress or appearance is deemed incongruent with the standards of the Academy by an administrator, the student must alter their dress or appearance in accordance with the administrator's directive.

🖶 Great Hearts | Lincoln – Traffic Flow Map



Community Investment

- Gifts to our Community Investment campaign support our operating budget and the teaching happening every day in our Prep classrooms.
- District schools receive significantly more funding than charter schools.
- Community Investment helps to buffer our school from the reality of public funding.
- Lincoln Prep receives approximately \$2100 less in per-pupil funding each year compared to our local neighboring districts.
 - This means that our school receives approximately \$40,000 \$50,000 less in funding per classroom.
 - Despite this significant funding gap, we provide more inside our classrooms than you will find at many district schools because we know that the Great Hearts education model is what our students deserve.
- Whether your family can give \$100/ year or \$1500/ year, every dollar is meaningful and matters. We want 100% of our families to be apart of this collective effort.



- Gifts to our Tax Credit drive are vital to our athletic and extracurricular programs. Tax credit gifts are used to support athletic, extra-curricular, and character-building programs that take place outside of the classroom.
- More than 1/2 of our annual athletic budget is funded through our annual Tax Credit drive. An increase in tax credit gifts to Lincoln Prep could transform our athletics programs.
- The Arizona Public School Tax Credit Program allows Arizona taxpayers to contribute to the public school of their choice and receive their contribution back as a dollar-for-dollar credit on their state tax liability.
- Couples who file their taxes jointly may contribute up to \$400 and single filers may contribute up to \$200.
