

Homecoming Dance Permission Slip
September 19 2026 – 7-10pm

This dance is open to all Lincoln Prep HS students who are in good standing. If you did not buy your ticket on the Portal and are purchasing your ticket at the door, this document must be signed by a parent/guardian to gain entry.

Dress Code – This is a semi-formal dance and students should dress accordingly.

For male students, dress pants (no jeans or patched pocket pants), a collared dress shirt, dark socks, dress shoes (no sneakers or sandals). No dyed hair or hats. Hair should be trimmed appropriately.

For female students, modest-length skirts or dresses with hems that approach the knee, or appropriately fitting dress pants. Bare midriffs are not acceptable. Modestly cut sleeveless tops/dresses are allowed; ladies may not wear strapless, spaghetti-strap, or tank tops. Girls should wear dress shoes. No flip-flops. Hair should be styled appropriately.

Pick Up/Drop Off – Students may start arriving at 6:50pm. Doors will open at 7pm. Students should be dropped off and picked up at the north playground gate next to the front office. This dance is closed to parents and there will be no “in and out” privileges. The entrance/exit will be monitored. Student should be picked up by 10:15pm.

Cell Phone Policy – Students will be allowed to bring cellphones to the event. However, all cell phones will be checked at the door by a faculty chaperone. Students will, at the door, place their phone into an envelope and be given a claim ticket so they may pick their phone up at the end of the night. A phone will be available for use throughout the night should an emergency arise. Students found using a cellphone during the event will be given a warning and escorted to check in. A second offense will result in the student being asked to leave the event.

Behavior Expectations – Students are expected to follow school rules for behavior and to comport themselves appropriately, displaying respect, courtesy, and helpfulness to fellow students and to chaperones. They must follow directions given by chaperones and refrain from public displays of affection. Any violation of Lincoln Prep’s code of behavior may result in a call to parents and the student’s removal from the dance.

Although the Academy does sponsor social events, these events should not be viewed as the promotion of romantic relationships between our young men and young women. The Academy believes that young men and women should be friends. We encourage their socializing together and the development of healthy relationships among them. Romantic relationships, on the other hand, can take up an enormous amount of the consciousness of young people. This is why the Academy prohibits activity like holding hands, kissing, and other overt forms of romantic behavior among students while on campus and at all Academy-related events.
